

A Bill to Ensure a Mandatory Study Hall for High School Students

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1:** All high schools should require students to be enrolled in a study hall class.

3 **SECTION 2:** A study hall is a period of time during the school day that is set aside for study.

4 **SECTION 3:** Each study hall period will take place after all lunch shifts are completed and
5 before any athletic activities or senior projects begin.

6 **SECTION 4:** The study hall period will last a minimum of thirty minutes.

7 **SECTION 5:** The allotted time for the study hall shall be acquired by taking an equal amount
8 of time per each class, therefore assuring students get the mandatory thirty
9 minutes for lunch and no classes have a shorter class time than others.

10 **SECTION 6:** This shall take effect the immediate school year after passage.

11 **SECTION : ALL BILLS IN CONFLICT WITH THIS LEGISLATION WILL HEREBY BE NULL AND**
12 **VOID.**

Bartlett High School

1 Be it enacted by the House in Student Congress assembled that

2 **Section 1.** Faculty and administration will not be held liable for any lawsuits
3 charged against them for administering corporal punishment in a just and
4 fair manner.

5 **Section 2.** Corporal punishment will only be administered under
6 circumstances that exceed mundane infractions such as talking.

7 **A.** These excessive violations include the following:

8 **1.** Theft

9 **2.** Fighting

10 **3.** Disrespect toward teachers

11 **4.** Repeated infractions

12 **B.** The punishment must be administered by an appointed official and
13 supervised by two other administrators.

14 **C.** The reprimand must be administered

15 **1.** with a paddle not to exceed 12 inches for the elementary students or

16 **2.** with a larger paddle not to exceed 2 feet for other students.

17 **Section 3.** Any official found in violation of these guidelines will be
18 subjected to a possible indictment on criminal charges and/or a minimum
19 fine of \$1000.

A Bill to Fund the Euthanization of Dogs to Depopulate the Feral Dog Population

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT

SECTION 1. All dogs born within the United States without owners or those which have been donated by individual owners will be euthanized.

SECTION 2. Dogs are defined as animals from *Canis Familiaras*.

SECTION 3. The Environmental Protection Agency will oversee this legislation.

- A. The EPA will be required to dispatch each dog unless claimed within 30 days.
- B. The euthanization project will be non-profit.
- C. The dogs will then be sealed in sanitary plastic bags, flash-frozen, and exported for commercial use which will fund the bill and give a use to the carcasses.

SECTION 4. This legislation will be implemented upon signing.

SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

8 recommendation for the Department of Education to encourage school

9 districts to incorporate stricter disciplinary policies for excessive bullying

10 including but not limited to zero tolerance and/or criminal charges.

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT

2. Section 1: All abortions in the United States will become illegal.

13. to practice medicine. Any woman who gets an abortion will face a 5,000 dollar fine.

A Bill to Ensure the Payment of Child Support

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

4 payment as a judgment.
